CANDLE HOLDER SAFETY

First -- when making candleholders for sale or gifts -- you should ALWAYS use a metal insert! The insert is for safety (but careless users can still be dangerous) and designed to keep the flame away from the wood.

Brass Plated Metal candle insert sources: Packard Woodworks Inc. -- 1-800-683-8876 or www.packardwoodworks.com -- order #152101 -- or they have several other types of candle "cups" that are safer see page 38 of the latest catalog.

The Woodturners Catalog - 1-800-551-8876 or www.woodturnerscatalog.com - has candle cups - holders on page 77 of their latest catalog.

Also, some hobby stores such as Michael's or Hobby Lobby have the brass plated metal inserts - but I have never seen the candle cup in one of these stores.

We will repeat the "Year-long Raffle" next year: The BIG Raffle will begin with the January meeting, will last through the November meeting, and the drawing will be at the Holiday Dinner in 2005.

Here are the rules:

1. Only members of the PTWA Chapter are eligible to participate.
2. Each person who brings items for the monthly instant gallery will receive one (1) chance. A maximum of one chance per meeting.
3. Each person who brings items for the monthly raffle will receive one (1) chance. A maximum of one chance per meeting.

5. 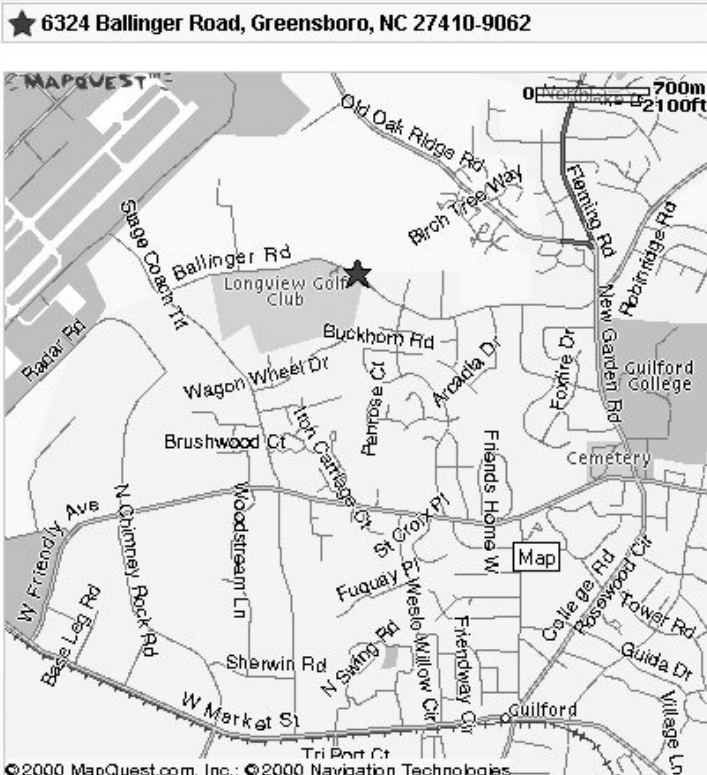

To the Leonard Recreation Center

 Some of the signage is confusing, so be careful.

FROM WEST OF GREENSBORO

1. Take I-40 E.
2. Take exit number 213.
3. Turn RIGHT onto **GUILFORD COLLEGE RD.**
4. **GUILFORD COLLEGE RD** becomes **COLLEGE RD.**
5. **COLLEGE RD** becomes **NEW GARDEN RD.**
6. Turn SHARP LEFT onto **BALLINGER RD.**
7. Leonard Recreation Center is about 1 mile on the right.

FROM EAST OF GREENSBORO

1. Take I-85 S/I-40 W/US-29 S.
2. Take the I-40 WEST/US-SOUTH exit, exit number 123, towards WINSTON-SALEM(US-421 N).
3. Merge onto I-40 W/US-220 S.
4. Stay straight to go onto I-40 W.
5. Take the exit number 213.
6. Keep RIGHT at the fork in the ramp.
7. Merge onto **GUILFORD COLLEGE RD.**
8. **GUILFORD COLLEGE RD** becomes **COLLEGE RD.**
9. **COLLEGE RD** becomes **NEW GARDEN RD.**
10. Turn SHARP LEFT onto **BALLINGER RD.**
11. Leonard Recreation Center is about 1 mile on the right.

“An accident at the lathe can happen with blinding suddenness; respiratory problems can build over years. Take appropriate precautions when you turn. Safety guidelines are published in the AAW Resource Directory. Following them will help ensure that you can continue to enjoy woodturning.
