Minutes from March 14 Meeting

Steve Coley opened the meeting at the Leonard Center at 6:30. We now have 79 paid members. Crystal Earley is tonight's demonstrator, and Dave MacInnes has the April demo. The president's Challenge was flowers and/or Easter eggs, and we had several submissions. The Turner of the Month was Geoff Purser, who provided a live edge bowl. Don Keefer is next month's TOM. Steve reminded everyone about the NC Symposium 11/3 - 11/5 here at the Coliseum, and requested volunteer help and hospitality for the out-oftown presenters. Those offering hospitality should live within 30 minutes of the Coliseum. We are proposing a dinner/mini-demo meeting for May, and we're looking for volunteers for the mini-demos. Bob Schasse gave the Treasurer's report. Members will receive a 10% discount from Penn State Industries. You should have received an email from them by

now. Jim Barbour discussed the Club store, and added a new feature - the "Member-to-Member" table, where you can sell your unwanted items. The Instant Gallery followed, we took a break, and held the raffle.

Crystal Earley was our demonstrator, and her topic was "Gnomes". She uses whatever scrap wood she has on hand, and sometimes uses contrasting woods for the body and the hat. Starting with the body, she finds the center on both ends, and holds the piece in the chuck and center. She turns the OD of the body smaller than the OD of the hat. She turns a tenon and mounts the body in the chuck. As her gnomes are actually small containers, she next creates the cavity using a gouge. She then turns the body to the desired shape and parts it off, being careful to leave sufficient wood so as not to break through the cavity.

She then drills a hole in the body for the nose with a hand drill. Next she turns the hat. She begins by turning a small tenon to fit the bore of the body. Crystal prefers to feel her way to the correct fit, rather than doing a lot of measuring. She completes the hat to the desired shape and parts it off. Using another scrap piece, she turns the nose. Using a cloth-backed material for the "beard", she cuts an appropriate size piece and glues it to the body. After the "beard" is glued on, she opens the cloth over the nose hole and glues the nose on. Crystal states that she enjoys the feel and smell of the wood as she works, and it is reflected in these whimsical creations.

MEETING LOCATION: Leonard Recreation Center (336) 297-4889). 6324 Ballinger Road, Greensboro, NC 27410

FROM WEST OF GREENSBORO

Take I-40 East to Exit 212 (Bus-40 Greensboro to Bryan Blvd). Exit is from the right lane.

At the top of the Exit 212 ramp take Exit 24 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about 1/4 mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come to the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM EAST OF GREENSBORO

Take Bus-40 through Greensboro

Take Exit 212 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about ¼ mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTH SIDE OF GREENSBORO *Note: Ballinger Rd. is now open.* Ballinger turns west from New Garden / Guilford College Rd. just north of Guilford College. The following link to MapQuest will detail this area. Directions from Bus-40 to Guilford College Rd have been removed since the above directions are much faster from Bus-40.
