I had seen this done on an old AAW Symposium video but I had never seen a live demonstration. I personally enjoyed it and I hope you did also.

Our demonstrator for November was Matt Birchfield -Turning lamp shades

Material used for turning lamp shades--green wood logs. Use the smallest part of the log toward the tail stock. Use a face plate on the headstock. Place both the head and tail stock on the pith as this will be turned out later and will prevent cracking. A roughing gouge or bowl gouge is used to turn the log round using the lowest and safest speed for the size of the log. Begin shaping the log to the desired shape of the shade. Be aware of any cracks or surface defects that could adversely affect the turning.



Once the log is turned to the desired shape, remove the tail stock and position the lamp on the turning. Once you start this process you must continue with out stopping because of the movement of the green wood. Using a heavy duty hollowing gouge begin hollowing the inside of the shade continue this process until you start to see the light coming through the wood, (This will be a bright red in color)

at this point you know that you are approaching the right thickness of the shade. You want to make sure that you leave the base, bottom of the shade slightly thicker $\frac{1}{4}$ inch to provide for support. As you continue turning the light will change to a bright yellow and this is the desired thickness $\frac{1}{16}$ of an inch.

Once this is achieved through the entire turning you are ready to part off the shade. Using a three prong support for the shade to sit on, you do not want to permanently attach the shade to the support because the wood will continue to move and you can just reposition the shade on the lamp.



1. Take I-40 E.
2. Take exit number 213.
3. Turn RIGHT onto GUILFORD COLLEGE RD.
4. GUILFORD COLLEGE RD becomes COLLEGERD.
5. COLLEGE RD becomes NEW GARDEN RD.
6. Turn SHARP LEFT onto BALLINGER RD.
7. Leonard Recreation Center is about 1 mile on the right.

FROM EAST OF GREENSBORO

1. Take I-85 S/I-40 W/US -29 S.
2. Take the I-40 WEST/US -220 SOUTH exit, exit number 123, towards WINSTON-SALEM (US -421 N).
3. Merge onto I-40 W/US -220 S.
4. Stay straight to go onto I-40 W.
5. Take exit number 213.
6. Keep RIGHT at the fork in the ramp.
7. Merge onto GUILFORD COLLEGERD.
8. GUILFORD COLLEGE RD becomes COLLEGERD.
9. COLLEGE RD becomes NEW GARDEN RD.
10. Turn SHARP LEFT onto BALLINGER RD.
11. Leonard Recreation Center is about 1 mile on the right.
