
I'm looking forward to seeing you all at the Leonard Center Tuesday,

Minutes from February 14 Meeting

Minutes from the February 14, 2023 PTWA meeting:

Geoff Purser opened the meeting at the Leonard Center at 6:30. We met in one of the smaller rooms and pretty well filled it - 35 attendees. We have 70 paid members now. We had three examples of texturing for this month's President's Challenge. March's Challenge is something to do with flowers. Jason Lathrop was the Turner of the Month, and he brought a different take on a bowl with a natural edge. Turner of the Month for March is Geoff Purser. Geoff noted that the NC Woodturners Symposium is here in Greensboro 11/3 -5. We will need volunteers and people to offer hospitality to the demonstrators. Guest Charles Hepler spoke about the "Empty Bowls" project at the Thomasville Memorial United Methodist Church, and solicited donations for their silent auction on March 17. See their website for more info. We still need more people to help out with our A/V system, and we need a Librarian. Bob Schasse gave the

Treasurer's report. We took a break, then held the raffle and the Instant Gallery.

Steve Coley was this evening's demonstrator, and his topic was "Square Bowls". He passed around several examples for us to refer to during the demo. He started with a square blank 6" X 6" X 2". He cuts arcs on the sides using a template. He also demonstrated a jig he built to saw uniform arcs on the bandsaw. He showed a few videos showing this procedure. After drilling a centered hole, he mounts the blank on a screw chuck. After truing up the surface, he glues a sacrificial block on the bowl bottom using a paper joint. He uses white glue for this which dissolves in water for easy clean-up after removal. He also uses a light strip on the tool rest for better illumination. He turns a tenon on the waste block, and also cuts a center in case he needs it later for reference. Next he turns the bottom or "wings" of the bowl, leaving $\sim 1/4$ " at the points to ensure he has sufficient material for turning after reversing. He also sands the bottom before reversing and mounting the piece in a chuck using the tenon. He then turns the inside of the bowl.





FROM WEST OF GREENSBORO

Take I-40 East to Exit 212 (Bus-40 Greensboro to Bryan Blvd). Exit is from the right lane.

At the top of the Exit 212 ramp take Exit 24 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about 1/4 mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come to the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM EAST OF GREENSBORO

Take Bus-40 through Greensboro

Take Exit 212 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about ¼ mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTH SIDE OF GREENSBORO Note: Ballinger Rd. is now open. Ballinger turns west from New Garden / Guilford College Rd. just north of Guilford College. The following link to MapQuest will detail this area. Directions from Bus-40 to Guilford College Rd have been removed since the above directions are much faster from Bus-40.
