In April, we were visited by Joe Waldroup of Hayesville, NC. Joe showed us his technique for producing a natural edge vase. Starting with a green blank and eventually switching over to a previously turned dry piece, Joe walked us through all the necessary steps to complete this project. Joe also contacted me in the days following the demo and commented on what a good club we had and how he very much enjoyed his visit and demoing for us.

For May, Phil Fuentes will be showing us how he does his multi-axis boxes. Phil is an instructor at Rockingham Community College Center for Creative Woodworking, where he teaches all different aspects of turning. Many of you may have also seen Phil at the Woodcraft store in Greensboro, where he was employed up until its closing earlier this year.

Notes from our Secretary:

Noteworthy announcements included:

- The President's challenge this month is to turn a house.

- There was some discussion relating to efforts to organize a peppermill workshop at RCC sometime this summer.

After a break and the monthly raffle, Joe

Waldroup presented a demo where he showed us how to make a natural edge vase. Here is a picture of the sort of projects to which tonight's lesson would apply.





Joe indicated that

he prefers to work with burls. He also prefers to work with medium wet wood. For example, the stock for tonight's demo was harvested in 2012. He cuts the stock in a rough conical shape with the large dimension at the bark and the narrower dimension near the pith. He began by putting a spur drive into the bark and he turned a tenon on the bottom. He suggested that you should aim to have the final height of the vase be just slightly larger than the largest width across the piece. Joe reversed the piece and put the tenon in a chuck on the headstock. He then turned the outside to its final shape. Next, with the tailstock still providing support, Joe began the hollowing process. This process went on for some time. It was useful to see

how Joe used an extended tool rest. It was also amazing to see Joe continually and successfully work with what appeared to be an incredibly aggressive open angle on his bowl gouges. His aim was to get the walls to a uniform thickness of 5/16 of an inch (measured repeatedly with a set of calipers) and to leave ½ inch thickness at the bottom. After the finish cut, he sets the piece aside for 3-4 months to fully dry.

After that delay, he mounts a circular piece in a chuck on the headstock and covers it with a piece of foam. This functions as a jam chuck for the piece. The tail stock is pushed firmly onto the base of the vase. Joe then cuts a concavity into the base and adds some decorative elements. The arc of the lower quarter of the vase is adjusted to round on this new axis. A rotary sander is used to blend this new arc into the original arc of the outside shape. Joe finishes his pieces with wipe-on polyurethane. He uses 2-3 coats as sealer (sanded to 320 grit) and then an additional 4-5 coats (wet sanded to 400 grit).

As you can see from the photo, Joe occasionally embellishes his vases with some additional carving work.

FROM WEST OF GREENSBORO

Take I-40 East to Exit 212 (Bus-40 Greensboro To Bryan Blvd). Exit is from the right lane.

At the top of the Exit 212 ramp take Exit 24 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about 1/4 mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come to the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM EAST OF GREENSBORO

Take Bus-40 through Greensboro

Take Exit 212 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about 1/4 mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTH SIDE OF GREENSBORO *Note: Ballinger Rd. is now open.* Ballinger turns west from New Garden / Guilford College Rd. just north of Guilford College.
