- Newsletter coordinator: **open** receives input from President, Secretary, and others to publish the monthly newsletter. This is the key role for communication across the club members.

• Website administrator: **open** – updates and maintains club website. Notes, Jason Lathrop has been developed a new club website. We are just waiting on someone to help administer before turning on.
