

### November Minutes:

Jim Barbour called the meeting to order at 6:35. He indicated that we have 135 paid members and he reminded everyone that (1) membership runs from January-December (2) thus everyone needs to renew their membership, and (3) if you have not already done so—the time is NOW to renew your membership by actually paying your dues.

He told us that today Scarlette Rouse would show us how she makes a three winged bowl and that next month we hope to have Derek Weidman.

Jim then asked visitors and new members to introduce themselves and feel welcomed. He mentioned that this month's President's Challenge (following his first-letter-of-the-month scheme) was to do a piece of jewelry. Next month—February—the President's Challenge would be to make something with a finial.

An extensive and moving announcement was made encouraging members to participate in the "Beads of Courage" project. Jim then recognized Jon Cowgill, Bob Muir, Earl Kennedy and Jim Yarborough who were the four remaining founding members of our club. We were also encouraged to participate in the Purple Heart Association's pen project. We were asked to see George Sudermann who has blanks and bands for those who wanted to participate.

Jim took a count of those who have a Guilford County address. He then invited comment on the issue of attendance at both the club's July picnic and Christmas season dinner. He invited anyone who has suggestions to get in touch with him. He mentioned that Crystal Davis needs help with the function of scheduling demonstrations. I did not catch his name, but someone instantly volunteered. That is the way we always hope things will go. Thanks!!

The gallery was presented; we took a break; and did the raffle.

Scarlette is an ebullient and joyful person and it was a pleasure to listen to her as she taught us how to make a three-cornered bowl. She began by putting the corners of a cube between centers. She cut a tenon on the tailstock end. She then used a pencil to draw a line for the desired ultimate thickness of the wings. She then made the



initial cut on the outside surface. The piece is then turned and chucked up. She used a drill bit in the tailstock to do the initial cut of the hollowing process. She carefully cut in from the tips toward the middle until the wings approached the desired ultimate thickness. She then cut a lip, which would eventually hold the lid of the box, but in the interim it would function as the point of contact for the reverse jam chuck. The piece was reversed and while making the final cuts on the bottom, Scarlette did that move when the outside diameter equaled the diameter of the internal hollow, that is, she cut

through the wall and ruined the piece. This was handled with grace and humor.

She quickly turned to the process of showing us how to make a finial lid for the box. She set her calipers for the diameter measurement and set them aside for later use. She then showed exceptional tool control as she shaped the finial and parted it off.



Scarlette then ended her presentation by talking to us about her extensive participation in the Beads of Courage project. She showed us a series of photos of the boxes that she has made over the years. It was great to learn about the woodturning techniques that she uses for these projects, but it was more inspiring to hear about how she would customize some of her boxes for particular recipients. All in all, a very memorable evening.
