Message from the President:

We are fortunate to have our own Scott Conklin demonstrating his techniques for turning his beautiful pens. Personally, I am looking forward to this because I have turned some pens but, they never look as good as his. And I have never turned an acrylic pen so this will be a good learning experience for me. If you have turned some pens, they may be good items to show in the Instant Gallery.

Our January Turning Challenge will be to turn a mushroom. Several tutorials for turning mushrooms can be found at www.turningonline.com. The only restriction on size of your mushroom is that it must fit through the doorway, so it can't be over 36" wide and 84" tall. Other than that, the only limit is your imagination. It can also be as small as you want it to be.

Our February Turning Challenge will be your choice of either a plate, platter or wall hanging (a large platter). Several tutorials for turning one of these can be found at www.woodturningonline.com/Turning/Turning_projects.html. It can be as large or small as you want. It can be segmented, laminated, round, square or a rectangle. Other than that the only limit is your imagination.

Jim Barbour has graciously stepped up and is coordinating selection of a turning from the club for our chapter to submit to the AAW 25th Symposium turning gallery. At the November meeting, he said that he would like to use the following format for the club to select a piece for the gallery: for the following months, November, January and February, each participant can bring in a piece to be juried by the club members. The club will select the top 3 each month. We have two more meetings that you can enter a piece for the exhibit, January and February. One piece will then be selected from the juried pieces. That piece would be sent to AAW to put in the AAW 25th Symposium Turning Gallery. The piece submitted can be no larger than 8" X 8" X 8". The remaining pieces will be displayed in a local gallery. If you would like to get club and national recognition, this is a great opportunity to do just that. This is open to every member in the club. Remember, if your piece is selected, it may be sold to a collector or other patron of the arts, so don't submit a piece that you wouldn't want to sell.

We had one member who made a \$1,000 contribution to the club treasury last month. This will be used as the Officers and Board of Directors see fit to best benefit the club. The contributor wants to remain anonymous, so, on behalf of the club, thanks to that member.

FROM WEST OF GREENSBORO

Take I-40 East to Exit 212 (Bus-40 Greensboro To Bryan Blvd). Exit is from the right lane.
 At the top of the Exit 212 ramp take Exit 24 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.
 Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.
 Go about ¼ mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.
 As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come to the intersection of Ballinger Rd.
 Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM EAST OF GREENSBORO

Take Bus-40 through Greensboro
 Take Exit 212 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.
 Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.
 Go about ¼ mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.
 As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come the intersection of Ballinger Rd.
 Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTH SIDE OF GREENSBORO
