Minutes from August 8, 2023 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6:35pm, with Geoff Purser presiding. We had 37 total in attendance, with two new guests. Turner of the month was Louise Butler who gave a lovely pen, as she's quite well known for. Turner of the month next month is Jim Barbour, and I'm excited to see what he brings in. Geoff shared that we are an All-Volunteer organization and thanked our volunteers for their service and support, especially our set up and breakdown teams, and Jeff made a call for additional volunteers not just for the club, but for the upcoming symposium. Additionally, Jason Lathrop is looking for a volunteer to assist with our website, so if any of you have web master experience, please raise your hand, we need you.

The Treasurer's report shared that we have \$7686 in our account.

President's challenge for this month was a writing utensil, and you folks didn't disappoint. Our September President's challenge is candlestick holders, so let's see what kind of night lights you come up with! Don Keefer will be our demonstrator next month and if you've seen any of his work, you know that this will be a demonstration you shouldn't miss!

We took a break and held our raffle as well as showed our Instant Gallery. Thank you greatly to those who have brought in items for our raffle!

The evening's demonstrator was Jim Terry. I must admit I was captivated by his take on a bowl. I've never turned one quite the way he did, but I must admit how efficiently he went about his craft.

Jim shared how to safely and securely chuck up a piece of wood, then went into the importance of your tenon. Jim stated that most problems begin and end with your tenon. Once Jim got the outside of his bowl shaped, he used a Sorby texturing tool on the outer rim of his bowl, then used his bowl gouge to turn the bottom of the bowl, making the most fluid cut from his tenon up to his textured rim. He flipped the gouge over to do a sheer scraping cut (it only took two passes), to have a lovely, shaped piece that needed very little sanding. Jim did state he sands, then dye's his pieces, and will sand to 1000 grit.

Jim made quick work of the interior of the bowl and I'm not sure I've seen a better bowl demonstration. His technique was refreshing, and I can't wait to try it out in my shop.

FROM WEST OF GREENSBORO

Take I-40 East to Exit 212 (Bus-40 Greensboro to Bryan Blvd). Exit is from the right lane.

At the top of the Exit 212 ramp take Exit 24 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about ¼ mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come to the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left. FROM EAST OF GREENSBORO

Take Bus-40 through Greensboro

Take Exit 212 (To Bryan Blvd. PTI Airport). You will now be headed north on the new highway.

Exit the new highway onto W. Friendly Ave. and go left (west) on W. Friendly.

Go about ¼ mile west on W. Friendly to Chimney Rock Rd. and turn right (north at traffic light) on Chimney Rock Rd.

As Chimney Rock Rd. parallels the new highway, you will come the intersection of Ballinger Rd.

Turn right on Ballinger and go under the new highway. Shortly beyond the overpass Leonard Recreation Center will be on your left.

FROM THE NORTH SIDE OF GREENSBORO *Note: Ballinger Rd. is now open.* Ballinger turns west from New Garden / Guilford College Rd. just north of Guilford College. The following link to MapQuest will detail this area. Directions from Bus-40 to Guilford College Rd have been removed since the above directions are much faster from Bus-40.
